Hazelnut Slice (Mothers Day 2008)

Ingredients (Base)

- 2 tbs golden syrup
- -1/2 can condense (approx 2/3 cup)
- 1/2 cup of flaked almonds
- 60z butter
- 1pkt Marie Biscuits

Ingredients (topping)

- 250g block hazelnut chocolate (Cadbury) -60g Copha.

Method

- Melt ingredients for the base together and add crushed biscuits.
- Spread evenly over a slice tin.
- Melt Copha on high-takes about 3 minutes.
- Melt chocolate on high for 60 seconds, stir and cook on high for another 60 seconds.
- combine copha and chocolate.
- Pour over top of base mixture.
- Place in fridge to cool and set.


